



PRIVACY POLICY

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1. INTRODUCTION

Cricket Ireland is committed to protecting and respecting your privacy in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and applicable Irish data protection legislation, including the Data Protection Acts 1988–2018.

This policy explains how we collect, use, store, and protect your personal data.

2. DATA CONTROLLER

The data controller is: Cricket Ireland, Unit 15 C, Kinsealy Business Park, Kinsealy, Co. Dublin

3. INFORMATION WE COLLECT FROM YOU

We may collect and process personal data that you provide directly through registration forms, order forms, membership applications, or surveys. This may include:

- Name
- Address
- Email address
- Contact details
- Financial information such as payment card or bank account details (where required for transactions)

4. LEGAL BASIS FOR PROCESSING PERSONAL DATA

We process your personal data on the following legal bases under GDPR:

- Contractual necessity – to provide services, and complete transactions
- Legal obligation – to comply with legal and regulatory requirements
- Legitimate interests – including fraud prevention and service improvement
- Consent – where you have explicitly agreed to specific processing activities

5. USE OF YOUR INFORMATION

We use your information to:

- Process purchases, and service requests
- Communicate with you regarding transactions or services
- Improve our services and website experience
- Prevent fraud and reduce financial risk
- Comply with legal and regulatory obligations

6. SHARING OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We may share your personal data with third parties only where necessary to provide our services, such as:

- Payment processors
- Banking institutions
- Fraud prevention and security service providers
- Legal or regulatory authorities when required by law

We will not sell or share your personal data with third parties for marketing purposes without your explicit consent.

7. DATA SECURITY

We implement appropriate technical and organisational security measures to protect your personal data from unauthorised access, alteration, disclosure, or destruction.

8. DATA RETENTION

Personal data will be retained only for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes for which it was collected or to comply with legal obligations.

9. YOUR DATA PROTECTION RIGHTS

Under GDPR and Irish law, you have the right to:

- Request access to your personal data
- Request correction of inaccurate or incomplete data
- Request deletion of your personal data (“right to be forgotten”)
- Restrict or object to processing of your data
- Request data portability
- Withdraw consent where processing is based on consent

10. LAWFUL DISCLOSURE

We may disclose personal or financial information if required to comply with legal obligations, court orders, law enforcement requests, or to enforce our contractual terms.
